The Newton County Commissioners are excited to announce the Newton County recycling sites will remain open and available for residents. Please help keep our community clean and promote an environmentally friendly lifestyle by using the sites for **RECYCLABLE** materials only.

Please refer to the updated list of items that are **ACCEPTED** and items that are **NON-RECYCLABLE**.

The following items are **ACCEPTED**:

Paper (staples okay)	Corrugated/Smooth Cardboard
Magazines	Ream Wrappers
Newspapers	File Folders
Junk Mail	Poster Board
Phone Books	Frozen Food Boxes
Brochures	Cardboard Boxes
Envelopes	Milk Cartons
Clear, Green, and Brown Glass Jars	Plastics: # 1 – 5 and #7 ( <b>NO #6</b> ) Water Bottles Take-Out Containers
Aluminum Beverage Cans	Soda Bottles
Steel Food Cans	Milk Jugs

The following items are **NOT-RECYCLABLE**:

Aerosol Cans  
Shredded Paper  
Aluminum Foil  
Batteries  
Food Waste  
Mirrors and/or Ceramics  
Stickers & Address Labels  
Styrofoam  
Tissue, Paper Towels or Napkins

The Newton County recycling collection sites are SINGLE-stream recycling. SINGLE-stream recycling means residents do not need to sort/separate their recyclable items. Recyclable items should be clean and compacted.

Residents can drop off their clean and recyclable items 24 hours a day at the following sites:

Kentland – 109 West Dunlap Street

Goodland – Between Main Source Bank and Post Office

Brook – South Side of Water Tower

Morocco – North of Newton County Highway Garage

Lake Village – West of Lake Township Fire Station

Roselawn – East Kellar Street - East of Ceres Solutions

Mt. Ayr – Chicago Street
